

## Lokuta Eco-Village – A sustainable Orisha farming community



40 acre of ancestral land that had been abandoned for many years, now the ancestors are now calling for it to be used for sacred living among the Ikaile people in Osooro, Ondo State, Nigeria.

Located between Mile 4 and Ilebe, two hamlets that were settled by the Odojomo people of Igbotako township in Osooro, Okitipupa Local Government Area, of Ondo State. We are offering this land to build a self sustaining biodynamic farming community through Yoruba House Project.

Lokuta Eco-Village will operate a Botanical for the growing of medicinal plants. Our Goal is to build a learning eco-village, a community that lives sustainably using local resources for healing and to encourage food security thus elevating the standard of living of community members.

### **Commerce: Income Generating Initiatives**

Collaborate with **Igbotako Club10 Cooperative CMS Limited** a society of women farmers, to encourage collective trading.

Establish two CMDs, Community Market Depots, community shops for the buying of locally produced foods, crops and vegetables at Ilebe and the selling of same in the townships of Igbotako. Other materials and supplies needed within the communities will also be made available for sale.

Our long term goals are to share experiences with other villagers. To encourage climate smart farming that uses low impact cooking technology, such as clay stoves, biogas from animal manure and solar cooking. Grow organic vegetables for own use. Erect buildings with solar power to provide electricity for houses and computers, as well as for internet access.
